

n a world where everything either seems to cost more or is ravaged by shrinkflation, the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail in Alabama is thriving thanks to their tried-and-true business model of providing world-class golf at an affordable price. And their stellar replay rates are the opposite of shrinkflation, where golfers can pay less to play more.

"We have only had to increase our rates minimally on the Trail courses since inflation hit us earlier this year," began Jonathan Romeo, Vice President of Advertising and Marketing for the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. "We still pride ourselves on the multiday package discounts we offer, plus we have numerous local programs that benefit the daily fee golfer as well. We have really tried hard to combat inflation, including offering a \$100 rate with cart, or a buy one day get a

day for half price special for the out-of-state golfer. Also, we have been holding steadfast that Alabama residents can only book 11 days in advance. Since the traveling golfer is such a large part of our business, we want to make sure all courses have tee times available," concluded Romeo.

The only way the RTJ Golf Trail could be charged with shrinkflation is based upon their latest amenity, The Back Yard (rtjgolf.com/thebackyard) in Birmingham that is connected to the Trail site at Oxmoor Valley. Meant to be played in about an hour by a foursome, the nine par-3 holes can play as short as 59 yards with the longest at 132 yards. The Back Yard is a walking-only golf course designed with no water hazards and just a handful of bunkers so that even the most novice golfer will enjoy their experience. At the same time, the scratch player will be challenged by interesting and sometimes confounding green designs. »



Leave your golf bag in the car and grab your putter, a couple of wedges, and maybe a short iron because that's all you'll need to enjoy The Back Yard. {Editor's Note: When your wife tells you it's time to do yard work, you can leave the house and say you were just following orders. Plus, green fees start at only \$35 which is far less expensive than any yard work project I've ever completed.}

While the price you pay to play the RTJ Golf Trail might be of paramount importance, it's not the only numbers of consequence. Eleven stunning Trail sites are only the start. Multiple properties have hosted TOUR events (Ross Bridge, Capitol Hill, and Grand National) while seven have world-class resorts either adjacent to or nearby. There is even a separate RTJ Spa Trail throughout the Yellowhammer State for those who love being pampered after a day on the links.

A few Trail courses are receiving makeovers in 2023, so MGM (Midwest Golfing Magazine) always recommends calling before arriving. According to Romeo, the flagship project of 2023 is a full renovation of the bunkers and greens plus some ancillary tree removal at Ross Bridge, one of the Trail's most respected courses

just outside of Birmingham. The only single course venue on the Trail is scheduled to reopen in October. Tree renovations are also taking place at Magnolia Grove in Mobile, but daily play will not be interrupted.

It's funny how some facts seem more poignant when you hear them over the phone. When speaking to Jonathan Romeo, he made a point that the farthest drive from one Trail spot to another in the entire state is only 1:45 minutes. I remember reading that before, but when Jonathan spoke it, I again realized why the founders of the Trail, led by Dr. David Bronner in the late 80s, were so far ahead of their time. And with 10 of the 11 sites being multi-course venues, the opportunities are endless for Midwest golfers looking to start their season early. Plus, I just watched a great video on weather.com showing off an above average weather forecast for most of Alabama from February through March.


Through the years, the staff of MGM has been blessed to play every RTJ Golf Trail site, and with that, we were bound to develop a few favorites. Now, granted this is like picking your hometown team's top championship season memory, but we will give it a try.

Capitol Hill is technically in Prattville, Alabama, but is only 12 miles from the capitol building in Montgomery. The 54-hole property is divided into three championship nines, the Judge, the Senator, and the Legislator, which pays respect to Alabama's nearby seat of government. The trio is spread out over 1,500 acres that is part arboretum, part wildlife sanctuary, and part golf course.

The Judge is hallmarked by spectacular vistas along 200 acres amongst the backwaters of the Alabama River. The first tee lies 200 feet above the fairway overlooking the river and the Montgomery skyline and makes for the ideal group photo op. With 14 holes adjoining the water and a bulkheaded island green, the Judge beckons to be played twice in the same day so your senses can have time to take in all the beauty.

The Legislator is a more traditional course than the Judge as it plays in and out of pine trees and along a bluff overlooking the Alabama River. Holes 10 through 15 are laid out in a native cypress swamp and feature epic views as you ride down the "Sky Bridge." The final three then lead you back up to Capitol Hill's stunning shared clubhouse.

The Senator, a Scottish-Links style course, is home to more than 140 pothole bunkers



and mounds ranging from 20 to 40 feet in height. These moguls make every hole play silently unto itself and create a feeling of isolation for four-plus hours. New TifEagle Ultradwarf greens were installed on the Senator Course in 2020, which only adds to the superior playing conditions on the Trail. The 54-hole facility is buoyed by the nearby Renaissance Montgomery Hotel & Spa at the Convention Center, a 140,000-squarefoot palatial estate that provides luxurious stay and play packages for locals and traveling golfers alike.

Less than an hour south of Capitol Hill resides Cambrian Ridge, a 27-hole facility that is highlighted by three distinctive, nine-hole tracks. Descriptive course names abound on the Trail, as the nines are dubbed the Canyon, Loblolly, and Sherling, which gives a nod to nearby Lake Sherling.

66 I again realized why the founders of the Trail, led by Dr. David Bronner in the late 80s, were so far ahead of their time.

The Canyon nine is carved from former hunting grounds where deer blinds remain nailed to the hardwood. You'd better pick your targets wisely, as omnipresent hazards are everywhere, making the Canyon nine a lesson in risk vs. reward and course management.

If you're looking for an Augusta-like experience in Alabama, then look no further than the Loblolly nine. The course is known for its gently rolling fairways, massive bunkers, cathedral-like pines, and water-fronted greens. Trust me, it's a thrilling combination that will test every shot in your bag!

Finally, the Sherling nine starts at the highest point in Butler County and tumbles to play along Sherling Lake before ending with a dramatic climb on the finishing hole. The par-4 9th plays



368-yards straight uphill to a 192-foot deep green that it shares with the 9th hole on the Canyon Course.

Northeast of both Capitol Hill and Cambrian Ridge rests Grand National in Auburn/Opelika. The course is only a pitching wedge away from Auburn University, the school that produced three transcendent athletes from the 80s and 90s - Charles Barkley, Bo Jackson, and Frank Thomas. Voted the #1 public golf facility in America by the readers of Golf World, Robert Trent Jones Sr. is on record saying that Grand National was the single greatest natural site for golf he had ever seen. Grand National is built on 600-acre Lake Saugahatchee with 32 of the 54 holes draped along its shores. The property is also accentuated by the nearby Auburn Marriott Opelika Resort & Spa at Grand National, one of the top lodging options on the Trail.

The Lake Course features 12 holes hugging the shoreline including all four par-3s. While the 230-yard island green 15th may get all the accolades, Director of Golf Joe McNally has his favorite for good reason. "While I think that all the par 3s on the property are great, No. 3 on the Lake Course is my favorite because it is the site of my only hole-in-one on the property. The hole plays along the lake with all but a sliver of the right side over the water. The green has three defined quadrants that, depending on the placement of tees and pins, can make the shot selections very different," ended McNally.

The Links Course, hailed "the cornerstone of the complex," was recently renovated to much fanfare. Featuring new tees, bunkers, and the very best TifEagle Ultradwarf greens, the Links is a definite must play along the Trail. The par-4 18th is without a doubt the strongest finishing hole on the Trail. Your tee shot must carry a corner of the lake, while the approach is played to a shallow pedestal green shored up by massive boulders.

The property rounds out with the Short Course, which is anything but your typical par-3 layout. The tiny gem, which was reimagined last year, plays a staunch 3,328 yards from the back tees and is an absolute delight to play. "The Short Course is the home course for the residents of the National Village; many of those residents are of retirement age," began McNally. "When we first began the renovation, we had two goals - modernize the turf on the greens and make the course more enjoyable for the customer. We achieved both goals and so much more: expanded teeing surfaces, original green sizes and shapes, land bridges to most of the greens, and a total reimagination of the eighth hole."


When it comes to the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, golfers now have a new experience to enjoy with the advent of The Back Yard in Birmingham.

The OG of golf trails in the United States - Alabama's Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail - has turned 30 years old and has just experienced three consecutive years of record growth. Other states have tried to duplicate Alabama's success of using golf to promote tourism throughout the state.

THE ROBERT TRENT JONES GOLF TRAIL CONTINUES





"Golf has given the state a talking point that we didn't have before," said Lee Sentell, Director of the Alabama Tourism Department for the past 21 years. "Alabama is a major golfing state. If they're golfers, they are going to come. It's just a matter of when."

The Alabama golf trail is the brainchild of Dr. David G. Bronner, who is the CEO of the Retirement Systems of Alabama. The Trail has been an unmitigated success as a major driver of the state's tourism industry. "It's an opportunity for the rest of the world to see Alabama in a different light than its past history," Bronner said. "The state's

tourism industry has grown from \$1.8 billion to \$25 billion. It opened the door to Alabama to the world."

To keep the golfers coming back and happy, the state has continued to invest in the golf courses. "It's really exciting to see people with low expectations be blown away by the golf courses," Bronner said.

Instead of coasting on its considerable accolades, the Trail has forged ahead with significant improvements, innovations, and renovations to several of its courses.

Why does the Trail continue to be a desired golf destination? "We don't have deferred maintenance issues," said Mike Beverly, President and CEO of SunBelt Golf Corporation, which operates the golf courses at 11 sites throughout the state. "They know we are going to be in good shape. And we have done some type of major renovation each year since 2005."

The RTJ Golf Trail has continued investing in existing courses and has not been hesitant to innovate and create new experiences, especially for younger golfers and those new to the game. In the past three years, the Trail has completed five significant renovations or improvements to its courses.



ROSS BRIDGE

The Trail's most celebrated course was shut down for part of 2023 as every green was replaced and every bunker was renovated. All the greens were redone with Ultradwarf Bermuda grass, a much firmer, faster playing surface. The renovated bunkers feature new sand and irrigation. The more drastic bunkers on the course had the bottoms lifted up to make them more playable.

The changes at Ross Bridge start at the first hole. The dramatic semi-blind tee shot, ideally played down the right side of the fairway over a hill, is still there. But the hole now has a wider approach into the green; it's less steep. This makes the hole more playable and gives golfers more options on how to attack the green.

Regular players at Ross Bridge will notice a few other changes. On No. 10, the green was moved to reduce the severity of the

dogleg and on the tough finishing hole, there is now a split fairway to give players one final puzzle to solve as they decide how to best play the hole.

But the most dramatic visual changes will be found on No. 14. The green was dropped in elevation, shrunken a little bit, and a

stone wall wrapping around the front of the green was added. The visual transformation was completed by adding a ribbon bunker that wraps around the front of the green. The result is a visually stunning hole that will become one of the signature holes on the course.

The renovations at Ross Bridge provide an excellent insight into how the RTJ Trail continues to adapt and keep its courses among the best public-access destinations in the country. When bad chemicals were poured on the greens by mistake, Beverly and Bronner decided to use the opportunity to make some significant changes. The result was an added expense, but the result will be a course that continues to impress, both from its beauty and as a good test of golf.

"The goal was to make the course visually appealing, but also more playable," Beverly said. Ross Bridge reopened in October 2023.

It's not surprising that how the course plays is at the forefront of the changes to the courses along the Trail. Bronner, the Trail's mastermind, still plays the courses. "Usually every Saturday and Sunday," he said. But as a true golf-aholic, he quickly adds: "That's only 104 games a year."





OXMOOR VALLEY

Nowhere is that golf-first mentality more evident than Oxmoor Valley, where the Trail's innovation has led to its latest creation, The Back Yard. The short course at Oxmoor Valley was a challenging, but difficult layout, playing from hill to hill, which was not good for beginners. Modeled after the widely successful Cradle in Pinehurst, The Back Yard is more of a transformation than a renovation.

The vibe is chill and fun and welcoming. At the first hole, as you wait for the green to clear, you can enjoy a drink while sitting in rocking chairs around a fire pit. The Back Yard is a nine-hole, par-3 course. It's designed to be played in about an hour by a foursome, perfect for a post-18 stroll with some wedges and a putter. The holes range in length from 59 yards to 132 yards.

While the course has been designed so that beginners can enjoy it without being intimidated – "there's now an avenue to run the ball onto every green," Beverly said – the transformation is a first-class course that is beautiful and challenging. "You walk it in an hour. It's unique to public golf in Alabama and unique to the Trail," Beverly said.

In addition to The Back Yard, the complex at Oxmoor Valley features two championship courses, the Ridge and Valley courses. The Valley Course underwent a significant renovation in 2021.

All new greens were built and two new holes were reimagined. The par-3 13th hole features a biarritz green with a four-foot valley in the middle of a monster-sized green. If you hit your tee shot to the wrong level, you're faced with a challenging putting experience. The rectangular bunkers framing the green add a dramatic visual element to what is now a visually unique hole.





The other major change came on the finishing hole. On No. 18, they dropped the green and raised and widened the fairways. "Now it's a much better finishing hole," Beverly said.

The changes continued at other courses, too.

The Links Course at Grand National the 54-hole complex in Auburn/Opelika - received new tees, bunkers, and the very best TifEagle Ultradwarf greens.

In Mobile, at Magnolia Grove, they cleared trees that were not affecting the course's playability so the grass could grow better, giving the course a lush, better conditioned appearance.

"It's been quite an interesting ride," Bronner said as he looked back at 30 years 66 We want to make sure that people want to come back. 🤧



of building the RTJ Golf Trail. "People thought we were completely nuts."

The success of the Trail as a tourism driver has led to other tourism-focused innovations. The state created the Alabama Civil Rights Trail in 2006, the Alabama Bass Trail in 2013, and the US Civil Rights Trail in 2018.

While Sentell is proud of each of these accomplishments, it all comes back to the golf trail and Bronner's vision for Alabama to become a golf destination. "He gave Alabama a new positive and progressive image through the golf trail," Sentell said.

Bronner is nowhere near done. He still gushes about the beauty of the courses, how the topography and scenery changes from course to course along the 400 miles of the Trail. And while, after 30 years, most golfers know about the Trail, Bronner is not ready to rest on that success.

He sees the renovations and innovations as necessary for what he has been pushing for since the first Trail courses opened: "We want to make sure that people want to come back."

The Battle House Renaissance Mobile Hotel & Spa opened in 1852 and has a historian who started there in the early 1970s. Across Mobile Bay, the Grand Hotel Golf Resort & Spa's historian is ready to share stories about the "Queen of Southern Resorts," opened in 1847, with longtime guests and first-time visitors. Susan Stein and George Moore are exceptional hospitality ambassadors who



bring the history of these iconic hotels to life. The Grand Hotel and The Battle House are part of the Resort Collection along the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. Each of these eight hotels and resorts has an interesting history and nearby historic attractions for guests to explore. Stein and Moore are Alabama's only hotel historians and rank among the best in the country.




f the thousands of employees who have brought the Grand Hotel to life, no one knows her better than Susan Stein, the hotel's historian. Having worked at the resort for 35 years, Stein earned the nickname "boss lady" from the late Bucky Miller - a legend at the resort. She has worked directly for nine general managers at the Grand Hotel during 25 years in the executive office before being named Grand Historian. Stein oversees the resort archives and is a primary storyteller for the property. She leads history tours and regularly speaks to local civic, community, and military organizations.

"From getting to know Bucky to working with the 40 associates who have worked at the Grand Hotel for more than 25 years to introducing the Grand's history to wide-

eyed children visiting the resort for the first time, the Grand has so many stories to tell." Sharing copies of guests' signatures from Honeymoon Guest Registries, which date back to 1951, is something she especially enjoys doing. This type of service and hospitality from Stein and the other Grand associates has not gone unnoticed. Historic Hotels of America named the Grand Hotel the top large historic hotel in the country in 2019. USA Today and Southern Living honored the Grand as one of the top resorts in the country for the second year in a row. Stein was the recipient of Historic Hotel's Historian of the Year award in 2022.

Before its closing in the 1970s, George Moore worked at The Battle House and knew its traditions and place of prominence. Through tough economic times, the hotel doors closed for more than 30 years. However, once renovated and preparing to reopen, Moore was one of the first people hired to bring "Mobile's Living Room" back to life. He is known by hotel associates and guests alike as Mr. George.

Named Ambassador of the Year in 2013 by Historic Hotels of America, Mr. George is an enthusiastic, dedicated ambassador that exudes Southern Hospitality. His performance has always displayed levels of professionalism and thoroughness, which are truly "a cut above." As the hotel's historian, he has toured thousands of guests through the historic Battle House. Mr. George goes above and beyond in everything he does. So much so, the hotel's



gift shop was named after him. From helping royalty during Mardi Gras to listening to elderly women reminisce about their proms at the hotel to welcoming international business leaders, Mr. George has done it all and done it well. In a time and age of emails and instant contact, Mr. George reminds us of a time that many may not know of or have long since forgotten. He is a teacher of historic hospitality and the art of conversation.

While the other six hotels/resorts along the RTJ Golf Trail may not have official historians, associates will quickly share historical facts about the hotels and the area. The Marriott Shoals' top luxury suites are named after Helen Keller and W.C. Handy, two locals who made a

difference internationally. All music played throughout the Marriott Shoals Hotel & Spa was recorded locally and the hotel has live music every night. Muscle Shoals has an active legendary music industry. You never know what legend or newcomer you may pass in the hallways.

While relatively new, the Equal Justice Initiative sites in Montgomery have quickly made a name for themselves. From A-list celebrities to schoolchildren studying the quest for justice and equality, the EJI attracts thousands of guests each year, many of whom stay nearby at the Renaissance Montgomery Hotel & Spa at The Convention Center. The National Memorial for Peace and Justice and the Legacy Museum, plus civil rights sites related to the Selma

to Montgomery March, the Rosa Parks Museum, and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s church are in historic downtown near the Renaissance. Many of these visitors will also visit Birmingham's civil rights district and stay at the Renaissance Birmingham Ross Bridge Golf Resort & Spa.

Whether you are visiting for a meeting, special occasion, or to play the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, each of these Alabama hotels and resorts are ready for your arrival. The Trail's eight hotels and resorts exceed international luxury standards and graciously welcome guests with a blend of history and hospitality.

Historic highlights from each of the hotels are highlighted to enhance your visit.

NORTH ALABAMA BIRMINGHAM REGION

MARRIOTT SHOALS HOTEL & SPA

FLORENCE. AL

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Overlooking the Tennessee River and historic Wilson Dam in Florence, the Marriott Shoals Hotel & Spa continues to be a Marriott leader for exceptional golf, spas, dining, hotel rooms, and guest satisfaction. The 199 guest rooms, including seven suites, have private balconies and waterfront views. The resort features

Alabama's only revolving restaurant and more than 30,000 square feet of versatile meeting space.

The Marriott Shoals Hotel & Spa is a short distance from two Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail courses - Fighting Joe and Schoolmaster. In addition to great golf, the Shoals area is internationally known for its music. Swampers Bar & Grille celebrates the area's rich musical heritage. Artists such as The Rolling Stones, Cher, Etta James, Aretha Franklin, Wilson Pickett, and hundreds more recorded in the Shoals. The area still has many songwriters and

active recording studios. For upscale dining, the revolving 360 Grille restaurant offers remarkable cuisine and amazing views of the Tennessee River. The 6,000-square-foot European-style spa and salon help make the Marriott the premier resort in the Tennessee River Valley.

Historic Highlight: The jukebox located in the hotel's lobby is filled with hits recorded in Muscle Shoals. To kick off happy hour each afternoon, a designated guest selects the song of the day, which plays throughout the property.



RENAISSANCE BIRMINGHAM **ROSS BRIDGE GOLF RESORT & SPA**

BIRMINGHAM, AL


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Renaissance Birmingham Ross Bridge Golf Resort & Spa is designed to provide a unique environment of stylish comfort and sophistication. GOLF Magazine named Ross Bridge one of the top 100 golf resorts and top 25 buddy trips in North America for 2019. Golf Digest editors named Ross

Bridge one of their favorite golf resorts for the past five years. This Four Diamond resort has 257 guest rooms, with balconies overlooking one of the longest golf courses in the world at 8,191 yards from the tips. Nearby Oxmoor Valley offers an additional 36 holes of championship golf and a newly opened 9-hole par-3 course known as The Back Yard, featuring fun but challenging greens.

Ross Bridge offers luxurious pampering in a 12,000-square-foot European spa and the resort has multiple restaurants, including Brock's, which hosts the best brunch in Birmingham. The lobby bar, JT's, hosts live music, custom cocktails, and an extensive wine list. The Clubhouse offers a variety of burgers, salads, sandwiches, soups, and tacos, plus plenty of cold beverages. For meetings or special events, Ross Bridge has 15,000 square feet of function space ranging from a large ballroom to a smaller, distinctive boardroom.

Historic Highlight: Listen for the bagpiper playing each evening at sunset and enjoy a Scottish tradition with a Southern twist. Scottish by heritage, the Ross family lived on this land in the 1800s.





CENTRAL ALABAMA MONTGOMERY REGION

AUBURN MARRIOTT OPELIKA RESORT & SPA AT GRAND NATIONAL

OPELIKA, AL








Known by avid golfers as one of the most beautiful and challenging stops on the Trail, Cambrian Ridge in Greenville lies just 40 miles from Montgomery. It is well worth the ride for any golfer looking for 27 holes of jaw-dropping golf.

Since being named by *Golf Digest* as the third best new public course in America in 1994, Cambrian Ridge has not rested on its laurels. 2016 saw the culmination of a three-year total renovation of the original 27 championship holes set upon the most spectacular setting for golf in the entire state of Alabama.

The **Loblolly** and **Sherling** nines were completed in 2013 and 2014. The **Canyon** nine redesign and reconstruction were completed in 2016. The greens have

been redesigned to accommodate the higher greens speeds associated with our installation of the latest generation of Ultradwarf Bermuda grass. Additionally, many of the holes have been redesigned to open up views of Sherling Lake and deliver a challenging test of golf while providing players of all skill levels a variety of ways to play each hole and enjoy the experience.

Named the #2 public golf facility in the country by Golf World readers, Capitol Hill continues to get praise from golfers and golf writers alike. GOLF Magazine called the Judge Course one of the 10 public courses in America worthy of hosting the U.S. Open while the Senator was named among the Top 10 New Courses in the nation by



GOLF Magazine and hosts the LPGA's Epson Tour Guardian Championship.

Located in Prattville, just 8 miles north of Alabama's state capitol, Capitol Hill features three 18-hole championship courses with more than 1,500 acres of golf and nature. The magnitude of this facility allows each course to be drastically different from the others. Capitol Hill also features an innovative 360 degree driving range 400 yards in diameter.

The **Senator**, a Scottish-Links style course, holds more than 140 pot-hole bunkers and mounds 20 to 40 feet in height, hiding the cart path or any other hole from view. New TifEagle Ultradwarf greens were installed on the Senator Course in 2020.

The **Legislator** is a more traditional course, playing in and out of pine trees and along a bluff overlooking the Alabama River. Enjoy the view riding down the "Sky Bridge"

for six holes, laid out in a native cypress swamp, as you are led back up the bluff to finish the course at the clubhouse.

The Judge offers stunning vistas along 200-acres amongst the backwaters of the Alabama River. The first tee sits 200 feet above the fairway overlooking the river and the Montgomery skyline. With 14 holes adjoining the water and a bulkheaded island green, the Judge is simply magnificent.

Voted the #1 public golf facility in America by the readers of Golf World, Robert Trent Jones Sr. is on record saying that Grand National was the single greatest natural site for golf he had ever seen. Grand National is built on 600-acre Lake Saugahatchee with 32 of the 54 holes draped along its filigreed shores. National Village, a golfing community on the Trail, is adjacent to these courses.



With countless awards and recognition from every major golf publication, Grand National stands out as perhaps the only property in the country to host the following events and tours: NCAA D1 Men's and Women's National Championships; LPGA Tour; Epson Tour (LPGA); Korn Ferry Tour (PGA TOUR); PGA TOUR.

The cornerstone of the complex is the newly renovated Links Course, which is without a single weakness. Featuring new

tees, bunkers, and the very best TifEagle Ultradwarf greens, the Links Course is a definite must-play along the Trail. The par-4 18th is without a doubt the strongest finishing hole on the Trail. The drive must carry a corner of the lake, while the approach is played to a shallow pedestal green shored up by massive boulders.

With 12 holes hugging the shore, Grand National's Lake Course is every bit as scenic as the Links. Not only is the quartet of par threes on the Lake Course as good as any in the nation, the 230-yard, island green 15th may be the single prettiest hole on the Trail.

The **Short Course**, not to be overshadowed by the two championship 18's, is a thing of beauty, with more than half the holes touching the lake. Renovated in 2022 to include TifEagle Ultradwarf greens, this 18-hole course of par 3's might be the finest anywhere in the country.

The Northern gateway to the Trail is Hampton Cove in Huntsville, a 54-hole facility with terrain that drastically changes from one side of the property to the other.



The **Highlands Course** is one of the most picturesque and playable courses on the Trail. Long waving grasses frame dramatically rolling terrain and beautiful bent grass greens. One of the most recognizable landmarks on the Trail is the old mule barn beside the fifth hole, while the finishing holes are among the most scenic and challenging on the Trail.

Completely different from the Highlands is the **River Course**, the only Robert Trent Jones layout in the world designed without a single bunker. The River Course is laid out on former soybean fields in the flood plain of the Flint River and is a throwback to the way courses were built long ago, where dirt was merely pushed up to create the greens and tees, leaving

all else, including massive oak trees, as is. With water in play on 16 of the 18 holes, the River Course will challenge your shotmaking ability.

The **Short Course** at Hampton Cove is open and links-like, with water in play on 11 holes. It is a great venue for golfers of all skill levels and alternating tees allow golfers to hit every club in their bag.

Located in the southeast corner of Alabama, Highland Oaks offers three 9-hole championship courses as well as a 9-hole Short Course. This 36-hole complex features some of the longest and most classically designed holes on the Trail.



Each nine has a different personality. **Highlands**, the core nine, is relatively open with several lakes in play. The peninsula green at the par-3 6th has an elusive, beckoning quality.

Marshwood has been made famous (or notorious) by its behemoth par-5 6th, which stretches to 701 yards from the tips. The 422-yard, par-4 9th is arguably the

best hole at the site and has a tilted green elevated above a swath of wetlands. The Magnolia nine is well-named: specimen magnolia trees dot the higher ground, reached via a 1,000-foot long wooden bridge spanning a marsh filled with lichen-dappled trees. The feature hole is the 416-yard 5th, where a split-level fairway offers an option off the tee. The

Short Course, a 9-hole par-3 designed to accommodate players of all levels, winds through massive pines and features 3 holes with water.

The regrassing of the championship nines with TifEagle Ultradwarf greens was completed in 2020, as was the redesign of the practice area with new short game and putting greens.





The **Dogwood Course**, which recently hosted the 59th U.S. Women's Senior Amateur Championship, was completely renovated in 2018, while the **Azalea Course** was renovated in November 2019. The new designs feature gorgeous TifEagle Ultradwarf greens that lend themselves

to superb year-round conditions. The Lakewood Club has been named several times to *GOLF Magazine*'s "Best Golf Resorts in America."

The Experience is a 15-acre, state-of-the-art practice facility offering a beautiful and innovative social setting to work on all aspects of your game.

The new Magnolia Grove features two renovated golf courses. Each championship course received extensive upgrades in recent years. Golfers will find more "player friendly" qualities without compromising the integrity of Robert Trent Jones' original design. Magnolia Grove, the most southern location on Alabama's Robert Trent



Jones Golf Trail, was recently named one of the "Top 50 Public Courses" by Golf World Magazine readers. The Crossings and Falls courses are also listed in Golf Digest's "Places to Play" as two of the nation's Great Value courses and as "America's Top 50 Affordable Courses."

The topography at Magnolia Grove features creeks, marshland, and lakes with each of the 54 holes carved through indigenous hardwood and pine. The

Crossings Course, which has hosted both the LPGA Tour and the Korn Ferry Tour Championship, provides an open parklandtype ambiance. Several water features and crushed oyster shell waste areas were added to provide an exciting new look. All 18 feature the acclaimed Mini Verde Ultradwarf greens.

The renovated **Falls Course** reopened in October 2010 as the only par-71 golf course on the Trail. The Falls is characterized by

large, liberally contoured Mini Verde greens and massive cloverleaf bunkers. Several holes were entirely redesigned, giving the course a brand-new look.

Golf Digest has named the Short Course at Magnolia Grove as the best par-3 course in America. Recently renovated, it features all-new putting surfaces with Champion Ultradwarf Bermuda grass. This course is as good as any collection of one-shotters on a championship course.

Centrally located in the state and just minutes from the newly revitalized downtown Birmingham area, this 45-hole facility was built on former mining land owned by U.S. Steel. Sculpted from the peaks and valleys of the Appalachians, the courses offer scenic forests, numerous creeks, and challenging elevation changes.



The **Ridge Course** offers numerous elevation changes, heavy tree cover, and is incredibly photogenic. As a tribute to the area's mining past, the green at the par-5 3rd hole is buttressed by a shelf of exposed shale rock.


Completely renovated in 2021, the **Valley Course** features new tees, bunkers, and beautiful TifEagle greens. For those who have played the Valley in the past,

there are also a few new surprises out there with complete redesigns on a few holes, including the previously notorious 18th hole.

The Back Yard, opened in 2022, is a collection of fun, interesting holes that feature accessible but challenging hole locations. This 9-hole par-3 course is where you gather for fun, friendship, and cocktails. Enjoy a drink while sitting around the fire pit in rocking chairs overlooking the 1st tee and the 2nd and 9th greens.

Meant to be played in about an hour by a foursome, The Back Yard is designed with no water hazards and just a handful of bunkers so that even the most novice golfer will enjoy their experience. At the same time, the scratch player will be challenged by interesting and sometimes confounding green designs.



Beautifully carved into the rolling terrain of Shannon Valley, the scope of this property will amaze even the most-traveled golfer. Ross Bridge was named one of the top golf resorts in North America by GOLF Magazine in 2019 and has been a favorite of Golf Digest editors for the past five years.



The course meanders through indigenous landscape and around the 259-room Renaissance Birmingham Ross Bridge Golf Resort & Spa. Ross Bridge is the fifth-longest course in the world but offers multiple tees for golfers of all levels. Symbolic of an old parkland-style course, ten holes play along the banks of two significant lakes connected by a spectacular waterfall dropping 80 feet between the 9th and 18th greens. A gristmill added to the waterfall reflects the history of this old mining site.

The beauty and challenge of each hole leads many to believe there is not one signature hole but possibly eighteen.

Recently renovated in 2023, the course features new TifEagle UltraDwarf Bermuda grass greens, newly constructed bunkers, and several architectural changes that improve overall playability and accessibility. The par-3 14th hole features a new ribbon bunker atop the greenside retaining wall and will challenge the scenic 18th hole for signature hole recognition.

From multiple high points on the course, you can see the picturesque view of the 9th and 18th holes with a waterfall tumbling between. The 7th hole offers a par five that traverses a ridge high above the rest of the course. The 9th will leave you speechless as it is time to decide how daring you are off the tee. A split fairway allows for either a short challenging route along the water's edge or opt for safer play leaving a longer, more difficult approach to the green.





and Short Course provide a challenging and scenic variety of holes to play.

The **Backbreaker** features wide fairways, demanding greens, and spectacular views of the surrounding foothills, while the **Heartbreaker** provides a unique mix of great golf holes and unequaled character with the final three holes showcasing elevation changes and dramatic lake vistas. The **Mindbreaker** is an unforgettable blend of shorter, elusive holes set in a beautiful sanctuary of woods, water, and wetlands. The **Short Course** provides stunning vistas along a relaxing, yet sometimes demanding trip around Lee's Lake.

The Fighting Joe Course at the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail at The Shoals opened August 2004 and was the first Trail course to break 8,000 yards, measuring some 8,092 yards from the black tees. Bordered by dunes-like mounds



and tall grasses, Fighting Joe, with wide fairways, large and beautifully maintained bent grass greens, can play long, really long if you play the wrong set of tees, but this course is simply good, straight-forward golf. You can see where you're going. The question is...can you get there?

Some say the spectacular 17th hole is the signature hole on the course, but the 18th green overlooking Wilson Lake on

the Tennessee River will distract you with its beauty, if not its treachery. Travel + Leisure Golf named Fighting Joe one of the top new courses in 2004 for good reason. Long-hitters here will experience a test of champions, but from the correct tee box, all players will enjoy world-class golf.

The **Schoolmaster Course** may be a tougher course than Fighting Joe, but only time will tell. One thing's for sure, it's

a shot-maker's golf course with narrower fairways, demanding approaches to wellprotected bent grass greens, and still a length of nearly 8,000 yards! It's hard to beat the beauty that the 18th hole holds on the high bluffs over the river, but the waterfall guarding the 2nd green sure comes close. Make sure you've done your homework well, for the Schoolmaster will certainly test all of your skills.






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
